Overview of Level 1 (International Approved Competition) requirements

1 Sanctioning process

- 1.1 Application forms must be completed in full and submitted to IPC Shooting Office at ipcshooting@paralympic.org no later than 6 months prior to the commencement of the competition.
- 1.2 Applications submitted outside the given timelines or not completed in full will not be accepted.
- 1.3 The competition application must be endorsed by the relevant NPC (if the LOC is not the NPC).
- 1.4 IPC Shooting will announce its decision to approve the competition officially in writing.
- 1.5 If approved, a 100 EUR fee must be submitted by the LOC to IPC account and the LOC will be invoiced by IPC Shooting.
- 1.6 All international competitions approved by IPC Shooting will appear in the IPC Shooting Calendar.

2 Minimum requirements

- 2.1 **Rules:** the competition will be held according to current ISSF and IPC Shooting Rules.
- 2.2 **Programme of events:** the programme of events can be (the events in the parenthesis ‘()’ are optional):
 - Programme 1: R1-R9, P1-P5, (Falling targets)
 - Programme 2: R1-R5, P1-P2, P5, (Falling targets)
 - Programme 3: R6-R9, P3-P4
- 2.3 **Finals:** finals are required for all the events in all Programmes (except events R9 and P5).
- 2.4 **Time schedule:** the time schedule should be developed by the LOC taking into consideration the number of firing points, expected number of athletes per event, type of targets (e.g. paper or electronic). The schedule needs IPC Shooting prior approval.
- 2.5 **No. of days for classification, training & equipment control:** two (2) days are required prior to the competition days.

- 2.6 **Equipment:** full set of gauges and instruments for both ISSF and IPC Shooting (SH2 class) equipment control must be provided (Note: if the LOC does not own IPC Shooting equipment control gauges and instruments, please inform IPC Shooting and the purchase or loan of such items can be arranged).
- 2.7 **Event viability:** athletes from a minimum of three (3) NPCs must be entered by the final entries deadline. Otherwise an event is not considered viable and will be cancelled.
- 2.8 **Entries:** the final entries list must be sent to IPC Shooting office the day after the final entries deadline and not later than 4 weeks prior the start of the competition. The athlete's SDMS ID number, international sport class and sport class status (if available) must be included in this list.
- 2.9 **Technical officials:** the competition must be officiated by recognised ISSF and IPC Shooting Judges.
- Technical Delegate/Chief Judge (An ITO from outside the Host Country will be appointed by IPC Shooting);
 - International Judge (ITOs from outside the Host Country will be appointed by IPC Shooting);
 - National Judges (to be selected by the LOC as per ISSF rules).
- 2.10 **Classification panel:** an International classification panel will consist of two (2) International Classifiers and will be appointed by IPC Shooting. For protest opportunities 2 panels of two (2) International Classifiers each must be appointed as per the IPC Classification Code (total number of 4 classifiers).
- 2.11 **Results:** the LOC must submit the results from all events to IPC Shooting in electronic version in the standardised IPC Shooting Results Template no later than 7 days after the end of the competition. Results recognition will follow the IPC Processes for rankings and records lists.
